 - Dive into the data comparing progress between our in-person instruction students to our online students.
- 5. Feedback on SNAP plan
 - Include the need for getting cameras to be able to see the Walking Bridge
 - We are waiting to hear if they are going to put in sidewalks in White City.
- 6. Counseling Update
 - Live stream for our incoming 5th graders to meet the teachers and staff. We will plan a virtual plan to reduce the student's anxiety of entering middle school.
 - Students are benefiting from being in cohorts. Students are bonding with each other and the discussions in the classroom are more rigorous because they feel safe and comfortable with each other.
 - 8th graders received a lesson in November and a booklet was sent home that included grants. We hoped parents would call in to make an interview with the counselors to set up a plan to be successful in high school and college.
 - We have set up a new Serenity Space because of a grant in the classroom next to the counseling center (previously it was a computer lab). In the grant we received a lot of tools for students who have experienced trauma or have anxiety. Students come in and fill out a form/survey and then they can enter the space to relax and gather their thoughts. After they leave the room they fill out an exit survey.
 - Mrs. Davis has implemented a two minute calming routine to allow students to recenter themselves and get focused. She reports that the students are feeling better as they leave her classroom due to the calming of the routine.
